## EPSO Working Group Meeting Towards longer term partnerships of scientists from Europe and Developing Countries

Brussels, 16 October 2014

The EPSO Working Group on Global Plant Research – Subgroup on Developing Countries, met this Monday (13.10.2014) at GIZ in Brussels to agree next steps towards longer term partnerships of scientists from Europe and Developing Countries for sustainable intensification in agriculture. Participants shared state of the art of the activities from EPSO on Developing countries in the past 12 months, and discussed and decided next steps. They considered the overall context of national and European efforts to achieve maximum contribution and impact of the plant science community in this frame, and how we could help to improve this frame.

## Main conclusions were:

The high interest from both, the European as well as the African side to develope such partnerships, articulated at the 2012 FAO-EPSO workshop is continuing and increasing. EPSO and it's members are recognised as a largely untapped resource of excellent plant scienists and strong instituions in terms of research, education and strategy development.

EPSO and its members will advance several proposals and strategic linkages towards longer term partnerships of European and Developing countries' plant scientists. These include Underutilised Fruit and Vegetable Crops (led by Brian Thomas and Eckhard George), the Cassava Value Chain (led by Wilhelm Gruissem and Herve Vanderschuren), Education (led by Jean-Christophe Glaszmann), Embedding of tree aspects (led by Thomas Geburek), and Strategic issues (led by Charles Spillane and Karin Metzlaff).
